Community Service Hours with Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter

Instructions

1. The individual seeking to satisfy community service hours needs to email (cc parent's email) or call the Chapter Coordinator to discuss requirements. Minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian or sign the attached waiver for unaccompanied minors 16 years or older.
2. Should it be determined that Project Linus meets the individual's needs then the following steps must be taken before the Chapter Coordinator can sign-off on service hours.
 - a. Decide what you will do to assist Project Linus. Some options include making a blanket for us. Many people make no-sew fleece blankets. You need to use the [pattern](#) found on our website for that project. You can attend our meetings and help with blanket sorting and labeling. You can host a dine to donate night to help us raise funds for the chapter or do a research project on possible grants we may qualify for. You need to email or speak with the Chapter Coordinator to discuss your service hours and what you'd like to do for them.
 - b. Create and print a word doc with the following information:
 - Name
 - Date
 - Activity (shopping for fabric, making the blanket, attending PL meeting, etc.) If you are making blankets, you must log every date and start/end time you worked on your project to earn the hours you claim for making the blanket.
 - Start time
 - End time
 - Total Hours
 - c. Finished blankets and the completed record must be presented to the Chapter Coordinator with your (school/court) paperwork for sign-off before the due date.

1. My child may be in an environment where sewing machines, scissors, pins, needles, and rotary cutters are in use. My child will take care to avoid accidental injury from those items.
2. My child may be working with other adult volunteers aside from the Chapter Coordinator.
3. My child's work will be supervised by an adult. I believe that my child is mature enough to behave appropriately while he or she volunteers.
4. I understand that Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter occasionally photographs or videotapes activities held at its buildings and at special events in the community, for use solely in connection with official Project Linus publications, its web site, or in social media. By allowing my child to volunteer at Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter, I give my consent for PL to record and use my child's image to raise awareness about PL and its mission.

I release Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter, its sponsors, employees, board members, volunteers and agents from any and all claims and liabilities (including costs and attorney fees) arising out of or in any way connected to my child's volunteer activities. I further agree to indemnify and hold Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter harmless from any and all claims arising from my conduct or the conduct of my child while he or she is volunteering for Project Linus Annapolis, MD Chapter.
